Library plans Día de los Muertos activities

Redlands' A.K. Smiley Public Library plans activities to mark Día de los Muertos on Tuesday in Smiley Park outside the library and at the Contemporary Club.

Family activities from noon-3 p.m. in Smiley Park include crafts, a children's Catrina/Calavera costume contest and live music by Los Plateados Mariachi and Pati Luevano, according to a news release.

Free lunch will be provided by the Taco and Fun-

nel Cake Ladies and Nicho's Ice Cream, while supplies last. The A.K. Smiley Public Library is at 125 W. Vine St., and the afternoon activities will be in the park behind the library.

The 6-8 p.m. event at the Contemporary Club, 173 S. Eureka St., will include altar viewing, vocal and guitar music by Ana Gonzalez Jorgenson and a performance by St. Mary's Ballet Folklorico of Redlands.

Jenna Cortez Aguirre, director of instruction and choreography of St. Mary's Ballet Folklorico, will speak

on "Dancing Our Way to College," and Socorro Contreras, a member of Conversation Helps Adults Transition, will speak in English and Spanish on "The History and Meaning of Día de los Muertos."

There will also be remarks by Rosa Gomez, a member of the library's Board of Trustees; Redlands City Council members; Assembly member Eloise Gomez Reyes; and Mauricio Arellano, Redlands Unified School District superintendent.

Both events are free.

The Inland Master Chorale will open its 43rd season with "Poetry in Song," a concert featuring choral settings of poetry, 4 p.m. Sunday at Memorial Chapel on the University of Redlands campus, 1200 E. Colton Ave.

The concert will feature composer William D. Hall's interpretation of three of Walt Whitman's "Leaves of Grass" poems, with solos by altos Gabi Ochoa and Jacob Hall, baritone George Becker and tenor Zachary Krug.

Also on the program are Frances Smith Thomas' "My Feet Are Tired, But My Soul is Resting," with

soprano soloist Susan Meinders; and Matt Podd's setting of Sara Teasdale's poem "There Will Come Soft Rains," accompanied by violinist Jace Elliott and cellist Anne Ragni.

The concert also includes choral settings of poems by Robert Burns, Ogden Nash, e e cummings and others, according to a news release.

Inland Master Chorale's director is Joseph Modica, who is also director of the School of Performing Arts and the Conservatory of Music at the University of Redlands.

Assistant director is Zachary Krug, choir director at Vista Murrieta

High School. Sophie Tait, a graduate of the University of Redlands, is the chorale's pianist.

Tickets are \$25 in advance, \$30 at the door and \$10 for students and children. Season tickets are \$85 for adults and \$40 for students and children. Children younger than 5 are not admitted.

There will be no coronavirus restrictions in effect for the Sunday concert.

Inland Master Chorale's season will continue with "Messiah and More," Dec. 18; "Ragtime, in Concert," March 5; and "Carmina Burana," May 7.


