

The Day of the Dead is celebrated as an opportunity for friends and family of deceased loved ones to honor their memory through altars and offerings that help the deceased in their recovery trip.

Elements of an Altar

Earth



Earth is represented by the crops — souls are fed by the aroma of the har-

vest; quails and birds are fed by scratch and seed in the altar.

Wind



Wind is represented by a moving object, such as papel picado, as it moves swiftly like the wind.

Water



📢 🖉 Water is placed within a laction of the souls to lact the souls to lact to lact the souls t quench their thirst after their long journey.


Fire



Fire is represented by wax candles. Each lit candle represents a soul and an

extra one is placed for a forgotten soul

Butterflies



Cempazúchitl

Cempazúchitl (Aztec Marigolds) is used to create a path towards the altar from the entrance of a home as a quide.

Mat/Rug

A mat or rug is placed at the foot of the altar for the soul to rest after their long journey home.

Papel Picado

Papel picado is special paper cut in shape of butterflies and symbolic iconography. It represents the wind and the fragility of life.

Salt



Salt represents purification it acts to cleanse and purify their souls during the following year.

Copal/Incense



Incense is burned to guide souls via its aroma.

Adults can get COVID-19 vaccines at no cost to them!

The distribution of COVID-19 vaccines changed in September 2023 as these products moved the commercial market.

 $\mathbf{\hat{\bullet}}$

COVID-19 vaccines are still available at no cost to most people living in the U.S. through their private health insurance, Medicare, and Medicaid plans. However, there are **25-30 million adults without health insurance and additional adults whose insurance** does not offer COVID-19 vaccines at no cost to them.

CDC's Bridge Access Program provides no-cost COVID-19 vaccines to adults without health insurance and adults whose insurance does not cover all COVID-19 vaccine costs.



Who can get a no-cost COVID-19 vaccine through this program?

 Adults 18 years and older without health insurance and adults with health insurance that does not provide zero-cost access to COVID-19 vaccines. The Bridge Access Program will provide no-cost COVID-19 vaccines to eligible adults through **December 31, 2024.**

All CDC-recommended updated COVID-19 vaccines are included in the Bridge Access Program.

Where can someone get a no-cost COVID-19 vaccine through the Bridge Access Program?



*Providers must be enrolled in your health department's 317 program and participating in CDC's Bridge Access Program. Members of Federally-recognized Tribes can also get no-cost COVID-19 vaccines at Indian Health Service, Tribal or Urban Indian \ Health Program facilities, recardless of the enrovider's enrollment status with CDC's Bridge Access Program.
